In a city that used to draw its wealth from the presence of foreign communities, learn how Jews contributed to its growing power while segregated in the Ghetto and what happened after the gates were removed. Follow the story of Venice from a Jewish perspective while at home and learn about the places and some of the protagonists.

Venice and the Plague: a story of death, innovation and women



Epidemic events struck Venice several times in its history, originally with a devastating outcome. Commerce would be the issue: what would you choose among economic growth and health? Join this live webinar to explore the incredibly innovative strategies Venice applied in the ancient times to face the plague.

The Doge's Palace and St Mark's Basilica: Power, Justice and Religion



The Doge's palace was the political and judicial centre of the Venetian State for several centuries. Art was the best means for the State to represent its propaganda. Famous artists of the time were hired and huge wealth and creativity were invested. The basilica of St Mark's, too, became a symbol of Venice and revealed through its religious architecture and art more than faith and devotion. Learn the history and the stories of these iconic monuments of Venice.

Music in Venice in the 18th century: a women's challenge



In the 18th Century, Venice became a revolutionary centre of music. While theatres and opera houses thrived, the Ospedali competed as well, becoming music conservatories where the real protagonists were women, in an open challenge to the Roman Catholic Church. You will explore the role female musicians and singers played at this time in Venice and understand how this is connected to social assistance, as well.

The Accademia Galleries is an extraordinary painting collection in Venice featuring art works from the early Gothic age till the late Renaissance, including masterpieces by Giovanni Bellini, Giorgione, Jacopo Robusti called the Tintoretto, Paolo Veronese and Titian. While sitting comfortably on your couch, enjoy a selection of a few art works and explore in an entertaining way the reasons why Venice is a city of colours and how artists were influenced by the city's lights and reflections.
